




Ground Floor

By the year 2050, the urban sprawl of Mexican cities will have reached its limit. The high costs in infrastructure, time and harm to the environment, will make it impossible for the expansion to continue.

It will be necessary to increase the average number of inhabitants per unit of area. However, it should be done carefully, since the disproportionate growth of urban density creates different problems.

The "Houses for the Future" aren't the panacea, but only a microscopic and limited exercise, which hopes to one day become a part of a multidisciplinary solution proposal.

House No.4 was designed as a fraction of a pedestrian urban residential block with different types of dwellings, where the green areas and public spaces are to be shared.
